I spoke with Susan Ramsay, the Director of the Natick Council on Aging. While the Natick offices are closed to the public until further notice, all town employees are still reporting to work for the most part.

Natick's CoA has cancelled all events and other recreational activity until further notice. Additionally, they are not providing any transportation services either as their employee and volunteer pool is made up of at-risk populations. Ramsay also mentioned that they hadn't really run into any hiccups there as most healthcare providers are either cancelling appointments, or arranging over-the-phone appointments where possible.

Schools

I had to leave a message with the Superintendent's office in order to get a better idea of what Natick's schools are doing during the emergency. At this time, all that's known is what is known publicly is that the schools are closed until at least the 6th.

On their website, Natick does mention that they are currently running school meal pickup times for students in need. Pickup will occur daily between 8AM and 11AM for breakfast and lunch at Natick High School.

Like other schools offering meal programs, the entire process is done via drive-up and pick up. Parents are discouraged from exiting their cars and no one other than school personnel are allowed inside the actual school itself.
